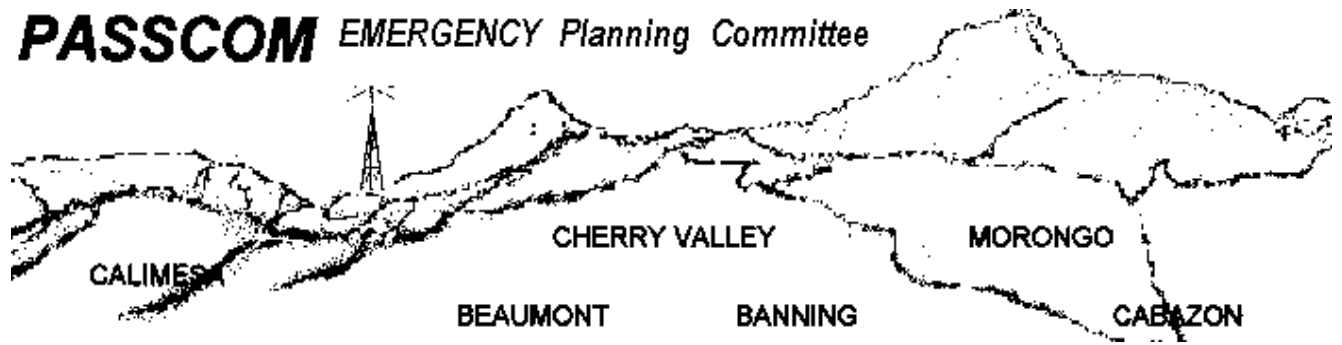

San Gorgonio Memorial Hospital Foundation	Valerie Hunter reported that they are doing the tribute to veterans and brought flyers.	
Riverside County EMD	Eric Cadden reported about the Corona Virus. The county worked as a team and had March Air Force base ready in 12 hours. The two week quarantine ends tomorrow. The virus is not airborne. Information is on the county website. The flu is more of an outbreak than the corona virus. Dr. Kaiser put one person in quarantine. We are very fortunate to have Dr. Kaiser. The corona virus can be tactile-not respiratory. (How do you sanitize gear and equipment?) You put it in a bag and contract it out. They are looking at contracts now- there was a lot of fear. Justin is no longer with EMD. (Marie LoPresto asked-“ with all the rats in LA is it possible (for the rodents) to pass it”) It was beyond his knowledge. March Field Day has 98 people signed up.	
San Gorgonio Medical Hospital	Joey Hunter reported that regarding the Corona virus- the hospital has had no cases there. There is also a shortage of N-95 masks. The hospital is well stocked. They are also working on a grant – they are very positive about it.	
Presenter	Mike McBride from FoxFury Lighting Solutions came. They are out of Oceanside California-they have been there for 17 years. Their products are developed just for emergency responders. They were first developed in 2003. They are “a company of many firsts”. The customer is first. They are authentic, adaptive and reliable. They are also world wide-in 68 different countries. He passed out a booklet with different lights in it and brought an impressive display of their product. They have many different light types; from headlamps to lights that can light up a football field. They also have drones. They do not charge to field test.

Plantation on the Lakes	Mike Simon reported that CERT field day is coming up on March 21. Make sure you go if you sign up. If you change your mind please let them know.	
Community Access Center	Mario Janesin reported that he received a sizable grant. It is part of the Listos California program. The goal is to provide emergency information. (Eric Cadden reported that there are two Listos classes in Mecca. It helps familiarize people with emergency personnel. They are 4-8 hour classes.) Mario has	

	<p>hired a fulltime person to help him. He also went to Simplier Life and made 500 emergency backpacks to give away. This is a yearlong project. They are trying to reach out to 10,000 people in a year. This is personal preparedness. Governor Newson would like one million people reached. SCE has also given a grant. People who are handicapped can't do a lot of things when the power goes out, it is a concern. They are finding that many things do not work ie. Generators, batteries etc. The best thing for them to do is to go somewhere where there is power. He brought a three day pack to show. He also showed a solar battery pack. Make sure with a handicapped person that you have a four person deep back up to care for them in an emergency situation.(Dennis Rice asked how a person qualifies to receive a pack?) Talk with Mario. Mario would like to give presentations- just let him know</p>	
Calimesa EC	<p>Daryl Schlicke reported that things are going well. They are doing Ham testing every second Thursday. The fee is \$15. They will be teaching a tech level licensing class at the VA hospital on Feb. 22 and 23.</p>	
Four Seasons-EPC	<p>Mike Mendoza reported that they are working on changing their mission statement. They are also changing the resident's handbook (you are on your own). They are also having gate and security issues</p>	
Calimesa City Council	<p>Ed Clark reported that he does not know about the stop signs. He brought it up at the council meeting.</p>	
Highland Springs Country Club/Table of Plenty/Red Cross	<p>The LoPresto's reported that there is a Sound the Alarm event in Moreno Valley on Feb.22. There is also a golf tournament on March 21 to help buy food for the Table of Plenty. It is \$50 a player.</p>	
LLU Health Beaumont-Banning	<p>Amanda Koleszar reported that Erica is filling in for her while she is on maternity leave.</p>
