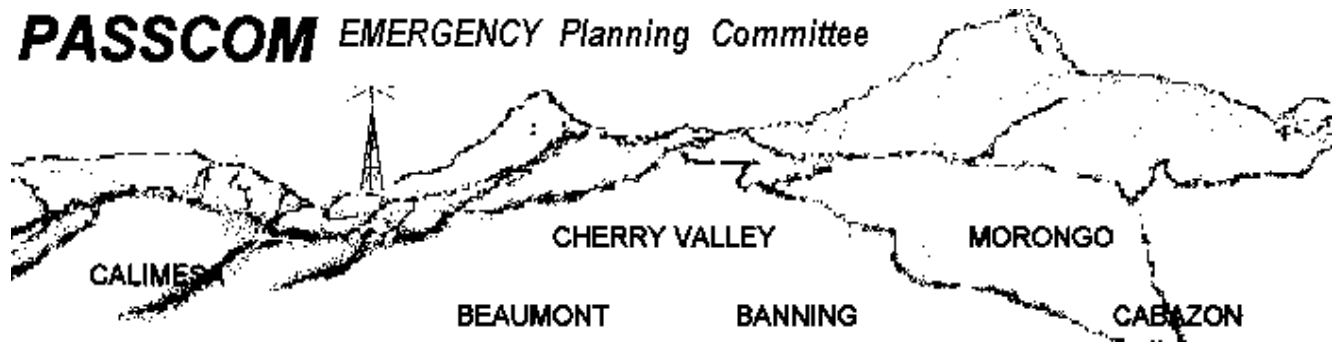

<b>Riverside County EMD</b>	<p>Stacie Kelly reported that they will be having a CERT field day at Ben Clark training center on March 16 from 8-12.(She handed out a flyer). 120 members have signed up. They need volunteers. Breakfast and lunch will be provided for volunteers. Please let Stacie know if you can help.</p> <p>Banning Expo will be held April 6 at the park. Mike will set up an information table. Serra Del Vista will have a booth. Roads to Idyllwild are closed. The 74 and 243 are closed. You have to go through Temecula or the other back way. Monday the 18<sup>th</sup> there is a community meeting regarding the road. <b>Calimesa Fire</b>	<p>Tim O'Connell reported that there were four on staffing and two on squad. Call volume was down a little. They are putting in a new parking pad. Tim wanted to know where they are in Calimesa regarding emergency plans. Mike Barron said they are working on it. Tim- Where are we regarding CERT?</p> <p>Mike- The city has nothing going right now. We need to get it. We are relying on the fire department right now.</p>	
<b>City of Yucaipa</b>	Sherrie O'Connell reported that they held a very successful Jan CERT training. They just had a CERT training in March. They also have a HAM class and will be having a training in June. They did their first Sound the Alarm event. They put in 220 alarms, educated 228 people. There are 41 mobile home parks in Yucaipa	
<b>AMR</b>	Dave Graham reported that roads are an issue. They have a post in Idyllwild. Season was much better than last year (knock on wood). They will be at the Banning Expo.	
<b>San Gorgonio Medical Hospital</b>	Joey Hunter reported that there is a table top exercise for this month. Farmers Market is held every Tuesday. They are also sending some people to train in FEMA.	
<b>Plantation on the Lakes/ Vice President</b>	Mike Simon- anyone participating in the Banning Disaster Expo will need to bring their own tables and chairs. They are not provided.

<b>Calimesa EC</b>	Daryl Schlicke reported that on Feb. 23 and 24 they had a big class. Mike Barron is now a Ham radio operator. They had 20	

	<p>students, 18 passed. The next class is with team Rubicon. It is a closed class.</p> <p>A year and a half ago the radios were activated. He would like to work with the fire department more. He has nine club members. Tim O' Connell said he is new to HAM but is working on it. He is moving forward- getting things to grow</p>	
<b>Plantation on the Lakes</b>	<p>Larry Spence reported that they had just bought an AED. They are expensive. It is in the common area. They are worried that it might disappear.</p>	
<b>Highland Springs Country Club</b>	<p>The LoPresto's reported that there is a new law that goes into effect in June. It says that there has to be an AED in common areas. You have to be able to reach it with in 4 min..</p> <p>Anita mentioned that they have quite a few AED available and many people are trained. It was also mentioned that Sun Lakes has one with security. Dave Graham said that it is so important to have an AED. He was outside of four seasons when a call came. He walked in put the pads on and brought him back. It costs a lot but saves lives.</p> <p>LoPresto also brought up that they have former Doctors and Nurses that are afraid of being sued- People said that they are good under the Good Samaritan Act.</p> <p>March 22 they are having a CPR training.</p> <p>April 9 they are having a disaster drill. How are you preparing? Do you collect supplies? Mike Barron- people do their own.</p> <p>Dennis Rice- every HOA is different.</p>	
<b>Plantation on the Lakes</b>	<p>John Keith asked how they could lock up the AED. They recently had a TV stolen. Six motor homes have been broken into.</p>	
<b>LLU health Beaumont-Banning</b>	<p>Amanda Koleszar reported that they have their AED in a box. When someone opens the door an alarm goes off. When the door is closed the alarm turns off.</p>	
<b>SPARC President</b>	<p>Sam Shoemaker reported that they will be working with the Expo. They are working with Sun Lakes on a drill. Beaumont is moving their EOC somewhere and sometime. Location is still undecided</p>	
<b>Four Seasons</b>	<p>Mike Mendoza reported that they are interested in getting emergency preparedness.</p>	
<b>Sun Lakes</b>	<p>Dick Heitman reported that they were given different scenarios this year. They also found someone to take T.J's spot. Now they have a team. Drill will be around 12pm on May 3<sup>rd</sup>.</p>	
<b>Highland Springs Village</b>	<p>Fran Flanders reported that they are going to have their annual spaghetti dinner fund raiser.</p>	
<b>Solera</b>	<p>Dennis Rice reported that they had several HOA's come and have lunch while they shared ideas of emergency plans.</p>
