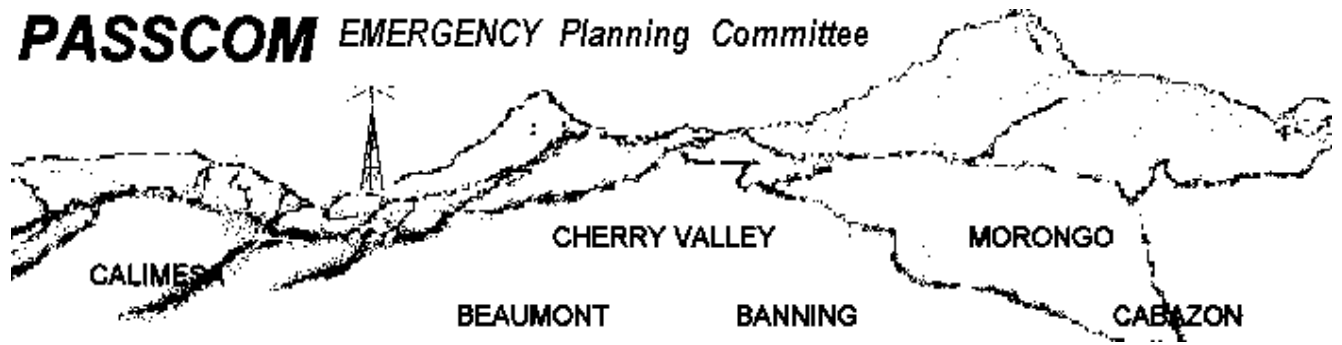

San Gorgonio Medical Hospital	Joey Hunter reported that they are trying to stay cool. Ham radio class is coming up. Hopefully a lot of associates will attend. They just received an antenna and a new radio.	
Community Access Center	Mario Janesin reported that he received a grant and FEMA gave him permission to print a brochure called Prepare for Emergencies Now: Information for people with disabilities. (He passed out the brochure and bags). He also talked about Medi-Medi. It helps people through the medicare medical system. Riverside VOAD has a new vice chair from team Rubicon. In August they did ZOOM conferencing. He is hoping by Jan. that they can use zoom conferencing. They have a new website. Riversidecountyvoad.org . Nest meeting will be the first Thursday in Oct.

	James Bean- he is from the Beaumont/Cherry Valley Water District. They think about all emergencies-terrorist attacks, earthquakes, fire etc. They have back up power. Earthquakes are a real concern. They are working on their updating their plan. Fran Flanders asked if they had extra fuel to help pump the water. Answer-yes but it does have some problems that they are working through. They also have different pressure zones. They can move water from one end of town to the other end of town as long as they have power. If the water line breaks they can reroute the water. It costs one million to drill a new well and one million to pipe it. They are going through different plans. If a tank goes there goes fire protection. All the water is ground water. There are a few ponds. They watch and manage the water. The State aqueduct is getting old. They do have enough water for new developments. Mike Barron said that building in Calimesa approved the water ten years ago. Yucaipa annexed that water for that area. They all have dual plumbing in the new houses. Bob Snedaker asked "Can you drill a well on property you own?" Answer- no, not if you are in the water district area.	

	<p>Beaumont is working on a water treatment plant. They are upgrading. Purple pipe is for recycled water (treated waste water). In 2000 and 2001 the system started going in. Cost has not been determined yet for recycled water. It is drinkable but they would rather not have people drink it. They have to do pressure tests when the two systems go in.</p> <p>There are State and Federal regulations (laws). Regarding Chromium six, the state law is more strict than the federal law.</p>

Simplier Life	<p>Bob Snedaker reported that he has been having some health issues but is doing better. He is looking into protective gear. He is considering carrying it (Backpacks, shields etc.). He is doing referral work. In July he had six times as many people in the store. Thank you for prayers and concern.</p>	
Highland Springs Country Club	<p>The Marie and Ron LoPresto's reported that they went to and event with the Red Cross for the transportation of blood. There is a shortage of drivers. If interested please let them know. Homeland Security came and spoke about Human Trafficking and slavery. The LoPresto's daughter knew several of the students mentioned. Sharetogethernow.com</p> <p>It is happening here. They say in TX there are 76,000 children trafficked every day. Joey said he wrote the first plan for Human trafficking. There is a way in the ER to help these victims.</p>	
Serrano Del Vista/CERT Volunteer	<p>Mike Mendoza Justin has taken over for Stacie. On September 11 at 10am in the Four Season Ballroom they are having a program called the 12 steps of Emergency Preparedness. SPARC is learning how to use the MESH.</p>
